CUSTOMS SELF ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (CSA)

- Designed for low risk, preapproved importers, carriers and registered drivers
- Approved importers and carriers must use a registered driver for CSA approved goods to cross the border (highway)
- Shipments can be processed more quickly and efficiently at the border, saving businesses time and money
- Allows Customs to focus on more high risk shipments to protect Canadians





APPLICATION PROCESS

PART I - RISK ASSESSMENT

Must demonstrate a history of complying with customs rules and that their goods are low risk

PART 2 - Part II - Books, records and business systems

Importers will be asked to demonstrate that their books, records and business systems have, or will have, the necessary internal controls and procedures including linkages, controls and audit trails




EXPEDITED RELEASE PROCESS (CSA)

- Importer, Carrier and Driver must ALL be approved for CSA for process to work correctly
- CSA barcode sticker applied to import documents by the importer and carrier
- When driver crosses the border, the barcode stickers and driver ID will be scanned and goods allowed to cross via the FAST lane

ACCOUNTING PRACTICES IN CSA

Approved CSA importers are responsible for their self-assessment and for reporting related revenues to the CBSA.

- SOA form is eliminated
- Importer must submit a monthly revenue summary form (RSF) to report to the CBSA on revenue from the importation of commercial goods into Canada.
- This report includes the amounts related to the accounting for goods (B3's), adjustments (X-type B3's), refunds, drawbacks, interest, penalties, and other CBSA assessments
- CSA-approved importers then pay any duties and taxes owing at a financial institution



POST VERIFICATION AUDITS IN CSA

Examinations of shipments will be reduced for CSA members since their goods are approved as low risk

However:

- AMPS Penalty amounts are increased for non-compliance for CSA participants
- Any large infractions may cause the importer to lose it's CSA approval and privileges (ie: contraband, drugs, etc ...)
- CSA participants periodically undergo a reassessment audit to ensure all agreements are being met and to ensure they are still eligible for the CSA program
